9. Future Planning

- -Deer Control: can we deal with this? Are the numbers increasing? Dave and Carol both feel comfortable that the numbers aren't increasing. No major interest in deer control at the moment. -Community education: Ann found the dams workshop and the landscape restoration workshops helpful and interested to keep doing more. Richard talks about what our priorities are, what animals are doing damage, where water is doing damage and learn about this.
- Continue with water in the landscape Dave talks about moving into landscape function analysis, small workshops on this, how we look at landscapes as a whole, learning about how everything relates to everything else.
- Propogation workshop: Frances from Newstead Natives or Ken from Neaganar Nursery to run.
- Weed workshop: potentially run by Matt on how to treat particular weeds
- Citizen Science: Eleanor happy to run a workshop on bird app and frog app. Carol mentioned including Friends of Muckleford Forest.
- Planning: Paul talks about NLP2 grants, potential for landcare groups to apply for smaller grants in this large funding pool. He is looking for a bigger project. A lot of thinking and planning involved in this, so we could do this now so we are 'grant ready'. Workshop on this to present a range of projects for members to comment on before we start to work up details into a project.
- Bike Ride to Maldon
- Barb wire fencing removal project on private land advertise for people who want to get rid of their barb wire, community education
- Bird box made by Middleton Prison, repurposed old timber into bird boxes, free. They also have people who can install them. They can make them in different sizes. Steve Comte. Interest from members to have them on private land. Formal response form Landcare to take them up (perhaps 100). Owlet nightjars., pardalotes, tuan boxes.
- Bassett Creek Stage 2 Project. First meeting of 2018 to start discussing the Bassett Creek project and start getting the letters to landholders.
